The CEMS Student Club allows students to participate in extracurricular activities and prove that their interests reach well beyond the academic framework.

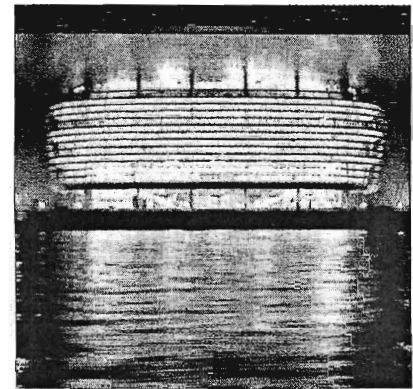
